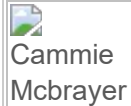

As time marched on and we became young adults I remember how I envied Candy for having such a wonderful open relationship with her mom, it seemed there was nothing that we could ask Annette that she would not try to explain to us no matter how risque some of the questions may have been. She was a woman ahead of her time in many ways, a true woman of the world , she was not judgmental about anyone or anything , I never remember her using fear to motivate us instead she opened her heart and her mind and listened without prejudice and in return Candy had such respect for her that she would have never done anything that would have disappointed her.

There were many times I am sure I wore out my welcome staying entire weekends at her home but she always greeted me with a smile and treated me like her own daughter , including me in their family vacations and trips to visit her twin sister Claudette, looking back those were some of my fondest memories. On Sundays she made scrambled eggs , bacon and toast for breakfast ...I remember

like it was yesterday but it has been many many years ago.

Even though time passes and people come in and out of your life there is a special place for those that were there in the years that influenced the type of person you aspired to be and today I want to say Annette Hicks was a remarkable unforgettable woman that made a significant difference in my life and I would like to thank Candy, Bobby and Greg (may he rest in peace) for sharing her with me in those very delicate years.
