She was born on November 7, 1973, in Haleyville, Alabama, and her life was a beautiful reflection of love, faith, and kindness. A devoted daughter, sister, niece, cousin, and friend, Juliet touched countless lives through her compassion and generosity.

Known for her warmth, humor, and generosity, she formed lifelong friendships and had a special way of making everyone feel valued. She especially adored her loyal dog, Winston, who brought her endless comfort and companionship. Even the smallest parts of life, like tending to her yard on weekends, brought her joy and gratitude.

Her happiest place was at her family home on the Tennessee River in Florence, where she found peace in the beauty of nature, fellowship with

friends, and the love of her family. She treasured sunset boat rides and evenings spent with friends by the water.

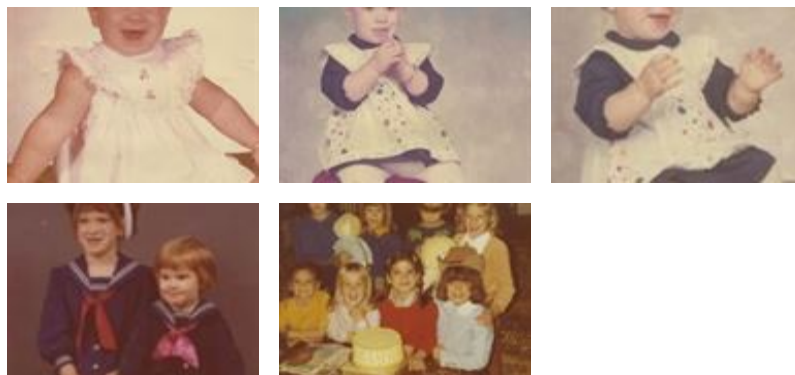
