“*My Dear Sullivan Relatives, I am so sorry for your loss of such a special lady. She was a joy to have in our extended family.....full of love, laughter, inspiration.*

I recall a special gift of time Lorene and Harold drove my mother, Alice Sullivan, and me to visit my father, Pink Sullivan, to Memphis, TN while he was in VA Hospital for eye surgery. We had no way of communicating with him and did not know he had eye surgery until we reached his room. He was blindfolded, lying flat of his back, and did not know if he would be able to see again after surgery. We were so shocked, saddened, and your precious parents consoled, bought us lunch, whispered words of hope and took care of us. I was young (about 14) and never expressed my appreciation for such an incredible gift.

I moved away from Hodges in 1957 and lost contact with cousins - especially Lorene and Harold. My brother, Jack, and I visited with Lorene and Archie in Hodges about 4 yrs. ago. Lorene looked beautiful as usual, was happy, gracious host, and we shared many precious memories. I will remember her always.

I hope you take comfort in knowing she is home with the Lord. I lost my bother, Jack, in October 2013 and I understand your pain. I rejoice in looking forward to that great renunion we will have one day.

I am sorry I was unable to be there for all of you. My husband, Nick, is suffering with serious illness and time did not allow me to attend Lorene's homegoing celebration.
