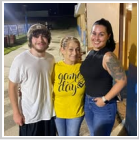

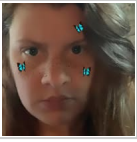

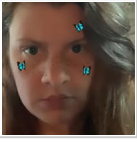

“ Told to me by Mrs. Angie Hargett on 5th October, 2017.

Miss Angeline (Angie for short) Vinson was at the front door of her family's store watching a couple of men who were stringing electric wire. This would be the first time their family would have electricity and the whole family was very excited. Their house and store was located on the Lawrence and Franklin County line. I believe they claimed more on the Franklin County side. This was about in the year of 1948.

She saw one of the men sitting on a 5 gallon bucket eating a raw sweet potato. Angie called out to the man and said her father had already ran off a bunch of pigs eating sweat taters from his sweet tater patch that morning. The man hollered back that iffing he done that to them... then that would be 2 sets 'o' pigs he ran off that day.

Sure enough, her father ran them off but it was more bluster than actual bark. In fact, it took Cooledge Hargett better than two days to finally get up the courage to ask for a date from Angie.

After they had had two dates they both wanted to get married, so they started making plans. They asked Spencer Glasgow who was married to Cooledge's sister, Lurly, to drive them to Mississippi to get married. They also asked Ross Glasgow and his girl friend, Juanita Fretwell, to ride with them to Mississippi to get married.

They made it to Mississippi to the Justice of The Peace and the marriage ceremony was preformed. Cooledge and Angeline Hargett were married for 52 years. They had 4 children, 2 boys, 2 girls.

It wasn't a bed of roses, it had its ups and downs, but when you came right down to it, it worked for 52 years and if Cooledge had still been a livin' we'd still be a countin those years, says Mrs. Angie Hargett.
