“ *Sharing a Memory, by Robert Uvon Frost.*

Before I tell some true stories about Terry Hood, I want to send my condolences to his Family. Now these are only a very few of the personal true experiences of which I will share. Terry and I grew up together near Rabbit Town, Alabama. We had more fun and excitement than most boys. From too young for me to remember until age 20 years, being young boys and neighbors' we were always together, when we could be. Doing farm field work, feeding chickens, cleaning out chicken houses, picking cotton and such. Nothing was too hard or too dirty for us. We always helped each other so we could go ride our bicycles after the work was done. We would wear out the bicycles parts and we would fix them ourselves. We would ride our bicycles miles and look for anything exciting to do. Terry could always find something exciting. We would go find wasp nests to throw rocks at until we tore them down. We would break down a pine bush and use it to fight off the wasps. We got stung some, but that was a part of the excitement. We would go snake hunting and kill snakes with rocks. We had already shot all our ammo hunting and target practice the day before. Terry was always a better shot than me and he would get more rabbits or squirrels than I would, but he would always share with me. Terry had a big heart. We would go by his house sometimes to take a break; he would make us some Kool-Aid to drink. He would put excitement in this too, by using an entire pack per each glass of water. It would get you ready to go again. We did far too many crazy, dumb and dangerous things to list. Terry had the biggest imagination of anyone. One time he found a large vine hanging in a tall tree on the top edge of a 50 feet high bluff below our house. Terry come up with the thought of how much fun it would be to cut that vine at the bottom and swing out over the edge of the bluff. Scary at first, we did that until it was not exciting anymore. We would surely have been killed if the vine had broken or slipped loose from the tree. Terry was a very good mechanic; he could repair anything. After we grew up, we would go riding to town in his very fast green 56 Chevy. If something broke on the car, he could repair it. Now I will tell you why something would break. Back in those

days, teenagers around Haleyville, Alabama that had cars would go out on Highway 243 at a straight in the Highway called "The 16th Section" and drag race. Not much traffic in those days. Every Friday and Saturday Night someone would put the word out that there would be a race. Terry raced that 56 Chevy many times because everyone wanted to try to beat him. Only one guy that bought a new Chevy Chevelle beat him and his 56 Chevy. The Alabama State Troopers made a surprise visit one night and ended the Drag Racing.

I walked, rode bicycles and cars with this dear friend and I know that I will miss him.
